## User precautions

It is essential to follow the precautions below when using the system, both in the interest of safety and to prevent material damage. Always comply with the laws of the country in which you are travelling.



## Precautions when operating the audio system

- Operate the controls (on the dash or near the steering wheel) and read the information on the screen only when road conditions allow.
- Set the volume to a reasonable level so that outside noise can be heard.

### Precautions concerning material damage

- Do not attempt to dismantle or modify the system, as there is a risk of damage to equipment and fire.
- Contact a representative of the manufacturer in the event of malfunction and for all operations involving disassembly.
- Do not use products containing alcohol and/or spray fluids on the area.

### Precautions when using the phone

- There are laws which govern the use of phones in vehicles. The use of hands-free phones is not permitted in all driving conditions: all drivers must remain in control of their driving.
- Using a phone whilst driving is a significant distraction and risk factor during all stages of use (dialling, communicating, searching for a number in the handset memory, etc.).

#### Maintenance of the fascia

- Use a soft cloth and, if necessary, a small amount of soapy water. Rinse with a soft, slightly damp cloth, then dry with a soft, dry cloth.
- Do not press the display on the front panel and do not use products containing alcohol.



#### Protection of your personal data

Data about you are collected via your vehicle. Data is processed by the manufacturer, acting as a processor, in accordance with the regulations in force.

## Your personal data can be used to:

- improve and optimise your use of your vehicle and the associated services;
- improve the driving and on-board experience;
- improve the road safety and predictive maintenance systems;
- improve the automated driving assistance;
- offer you added-value services relating to the vehicle.

The manufacturer takes all the necessary precautions to ensure that your personal data is processed in total security. To find out more about the use of your data and your rights, please visit the manufacturer's website.

The description of the models given in this manual is based on the specifications at the time of writing. This manual covers all existing functions for the models described. Whether or not they are fitted depends on the equipment model, options selected and the country where they are sold. This manual may also contain information about functions to be introduced later in the model year. The screens shown in the user manual are not contractual. Depending on the make and model of your telephone, some functions may be partially or completely incompatible with your vehicle's multimedia system.

Throughout the manual, the Approved Dealer is that of the vehicle manufacturer.

## INTRODUCTION

1

The Dacia Media Control includes the following functions:

- FM, AM, DAB radio and DAB+;
- management of USB auxiliary audio sources;
- hands-free phone system Bluetooth®;
- smartphone app.

**Note:** the Dacia Media Controlapp can be downloaded on your smartphone to facilitate use of the radio by using the smartphone screen as the main control interface. You can access additional functions (eco-score, eco-coach, navigation apps, streaming apps, etc.).

## RADIO FUNCTION

The radio can be used to listen to radio stations on the following bands: FM (frequency modulation) and AM (amplitude modulation).

The DR system (digital terrestrial radio in DAB format, DAB+, T-DMB) improves sound reproduction and enables you to access the "Radio text" stored radio text information by scrolling the text to display:

- news updates:
- sports news;



Your hands-free telephone system is only intended to facilitate communication by reducing the risk factors, but does not remove them completely.

Always comply with the laws of the country in which you are travelling.

The RDS system displays the name of some stations or messages sent by the FM radio stations:

- general traffic information (TA);
- emergency messages.

## HANDS-FREE PHONE FUNCTION

1

The hands-free system Bluetooth® allows you to use the following functions without having to handle your phone:

- pair up to six phones;
- make/receive/reject a call;
- transfer the telephone or SIM card phonebook contact list SIM (depending on the phone);
- view the history of calls made using the system (depending on the phone);
- call voicemail.

## **AUXILIARY AUDIO FUNCTION**

You can listen to your portable digital audio player directly through your vehicle's speakers. There are several ways to connect your portable audio player, depending on the type(s) of device you have:

- Bluetooth® connection;
- USB port.

For more information on the list of compatible devices, contact an authorised dealer.

## **BLUETOOTH® FUNCTION**

This function enables the audio system to recognise and control your portable digital audio player or mobile telephone via Bluetooth® pairing.

# Operation

## On and off

Briefly press on key to switch on your audio system.

The audio system can be used with the vehicle ignition off. It will operate

for several minutes. Briefly press to keep it on for a few more minutes. Switch off the audio system by

pressing and holding on 🔼 . The radio system display is shown in the illustration while switched off or in "Vehicle" mode with the sound muted.

## Choosing the source

Scroll through the various audio sources by repeatedly pressing on

. When scrolling, the audio sources appear in the following order:  $FM \rightarrow DR \rightarrow AM \rightarrow USB \rightarrow Bluetooth$ ®.

You can also select the audio source from the "Media" world.

Press . select the "Media" world

by pressing the on the steering column control, or , then

to confirm. Select the audio source.

When you connect a USB media source while the audio system is switched on then the source will automatically switch to the new media and start to play its content.

When you connect a Bluetooth® media source while the audio system is on, if the audio source playing was already Bluetooth® then the media content will switch and start to play automatically on the audio system.

## Volume



Adjust the volume by pressing on 4+

or  $\boxed{\P}$ . By briefly pressing on the volume increases a notch.

The display shows "Volume" followed by the current setting value.

### Mute

Press briefly on to mute the sound.

Press briefly again on the buttons

, or to continue listening to the current audio source.

## Listen to the radio



#### Select a radio band

To select the desired band among FM, AM or DR (Digital Terrestrial Radio),

press on to access the "Radio" world, then select the band by

pressing or , or press on

. While listening to a radio station,

press on to access the band selection screen.

## Selecting a radio station

There are several ways to select and search for a radio station:

- "list mode" 1 available in DR and FM;



- "manual mode" 2 available in AM and FM.

#### "List mode"

This mode allows you to search for available stations by scanning the list of stations in alphabetical order, then by frequency (for stations broadcast

unnamed) by using or , then

ok to confirm.

The radio station you stop at in the list will automatically play shortly afterwards.

To return to the list of stations, press or browse using on the

steering column control, 
or



To get the most recent list of stations, update the radio list.

For more information, see the "Update FM list" and "Update DR list" in this section.

### "Manual mode"

Manual mode allows you to search for stations by browsing the frequencies in FM and AM:

scroll to the higher frequencies using

on the steering column control or

- scroll to the lower frequencies using

on the steering column control or

By pressing on or :

- press briefly: to search by frequency step;
- press and hold: to search for an available station automatically.

### Radio/media information



This function displays the information on the frequency that you wish to see on the screen (see above). It is displayed automatically after a

moment or when you press OK

## Station memory

You can store up to six stations so that will be permanently shown at the top of the list of stations.

Select a band (FM, DR), then select a radio station using the modes described above.

To store the station, press and hold on

from the currently playing list and select the position in the Favourites. A beep confirms that the station is saved as a favourite.

By browsing through the list from the beginning, you will still be able to find your "Favourite" stations in the zone entitled – MEM--. Next comes the full list of stations sorted by alphabetical order in the zone entitled – LIST --.

The radio station you stop at will automatically play shortly afterwards. To return to the list of stations, press

, or browse using on the

steering column control, 
or 
.

## Selecting a station

In the AM band, the stations can be browsed by their radio frequency and in the FM or DR band the list of stations can be browsed.

Select the desired band (FM, DR or

AM) by repeatedly pressing on This list can include up to 100 radio stations stored the last time the list was updated.

Use on the steering column

control, or to scroll through the radio stations in the FM, DR list.

#### Media audio sources

Your audio system is equipped with a USB port as well as a Bluetooth® connection which can be used to connect external audio sources.

**Note:** the auxiliary audio source formats include MP3, WMA and AAC.

#### **USB** connection

#### Connect

Connect the plug of the MP3 player, portable digital audio player or USB drive to the USB port.

Once the device is connected, the track will be displayed automatically.

#### Use

Once the external audio source is connected, the first audio track will start to play automatically.


The audio system automatically restarts the last track played if the external audio player was previously connected to the audio system.

Once your external audio source is connected, its contents can be accessed via the multimedia system menus. It stores playlists identical to those of your external audio player.

To access the contents of your external audio source via your audio system:

- press to return to the playlist;or
- rotate the on the steering

column control or press or to scroll through the tracks.



- press to display the folders or

selection criteria. Press again on to return to the previous folder;

- press OK to select the folder, playlist or to listen to the selected track.

## Charging using the USB port

Once the USB plug of your portable digital audio player or telephone is connected to the USB port of your audio system (located near the driver's position in the passenger compartment) it will be possible to charge or maintain the battery level during use.

**Note:** some devices do not recharge or maintain the battery charge level while they are connected to the USB port on the audio system.


## Bluetooth® audio playback

In order to use your Bluetooth® portable digital audio device, you must pair it to the vehicle upon first use. Refer to the "Pairing, unpairing a phone" section.

Pairing enables the audio system to recognise and store a Bluetooth® portable digital audio device.

#### Note:

- if your Bluetooth® digital device is equipped with telephone and portable digital audio player functions, pairing one of these functions will automatically pair the other;
- the number of functions which can be accessed depends on the type of portable digital audio player and its compatibility with the audio system.



## Connecting to the vehicle

Your portable digital audio device must be connected to the audio system via Bluetooth® **a** or USB **b** in order for you to access all of its features.



Only handle the portable audio player when traffic conditions permit.

Store the portable audio player safely while driving (risk of being thrown in the event of sudden braking or impact).

For a device already paired, perform the following operations:


- activate the radio Bluetooth® connection;
- enable the telephone or portable digital audio device Bluetooth® connection and make it visible to other devices (refer to the user manual for your device);
- select the audio source Bluetooth®

by repeatedly pressing on -;
- select the external audio player or the telephone to be connected via Bluetooth® among those detected by the multimedia system.

#### Use


Your portable digital audio player must be connected to the audio system to enable access to all of its features.

**Note:** the portable digital audio player cannot be connected to the audio system unless it has already been paired.



Once the Bluetooth® portable digital audio player is connected, you can operate it via your audio system.

Once the external audio source is connected c, the first audio track will start to play automatically d.



Press  $\bigcirc$  on the steering wheel control to return to the playlist e.

Press or to scroll through the tracks.

To return to the playback screen d,

press OK or wait a moment until the playlist disappears automatically.

**Note:** the number of accessible functions

depends on the type of portable digital audio device and its compatibility with the audio system.

## Shuffle "MIX"



Press and hold on Model to shuffle all of the tracks in the folder.

The "MIX" warning light **f** appears on the screen. A track is then selected at random. The transition from one track to another takes place randomly.

Press and hold again on hold it to deactivate the shuffle function: the hold if will disappear. Turning off the audio system deactivates the shuffle function.

## Repeat "RPT"



This function enables you to repeat a playlist.

Press briefly on MoDE to enable the repeat function across the entire playlist.

The "RPT" warning light **g** appears on the screen.

Press briefly again on  $\frac{|MODE|}{|}$  to repeat the current track: "1" h will appear on the symbol " RPT ».

Press briefly again on  $\frac{\text{MODE}}{\text{to}}$  to deactivate the repeat function, the "RPT" warning light g will disappear.

You can also use these playback options: from the main menu, select the "Media" world then the USB source.



Only operate the portable digital audio player when traffic conditions permit.

Store the portable digital audio player safely while driving (risk of it being thrown in the event of sudden braking or impact).

## Mute the sound/Pause



Press briefly on to mute the sound or pause the audio track.

Press briefly again on or perform an action on the volume bar to unmute or play the audio track.

The audio system sound is automatically activated when changing sources or during bulletin broadcasts.

## Pairing/unpairing a phone

#### Bluetooth® connection

To activate the audio system's Bluetooth® function:

- press to access the main menu:
- select the "Settings" world then the "Phone settings" menu followed by

"Bluetooth®" using the or or

then ok to confirm;

select "YES" using ▲ or ▼.

then confirm by pressing  $\lfloor OK \rfloor$ . The Bluetooth® symbol will then appear

continuously in the status bar the screen.



For safety reasons, carry out these operations when the vehicle is stationary.

## Pairing a phone

To use your hands-free system, pair your Bluetooth® mobile phone with the vehicle. Check that the your phone's Bluetooth® function is activated and set its status to "visible".

Pairing will enable the hands-free phone system to recognise and store a phone.

You can pair up to six phones, but only one can be connected at a time.

Pairing can be performed either via the audio system or via your phone.

Your audio system and phone must both be switched on.

Note: if you pair a new phone while another phone is already connected to the audio system, it will be disconnected and replaced by the new paired phone.



### Pairing a Bluetooth® phone with the audio system via the audio system

This method allows you to make a Bluetooth® search from the audio system.

To pair a phone, carry out the following operations:

- activate Bluetooth®:
- press to access the main menu:
- select the "Settings" world, then the

"Phone settings" menu using the



or then ok to confirm:

select "Search for phone" using



or . then ok to confirm.

A message is displayed on the screen.

Press OK to start searching.

The search for Bluetooth® devices in the vicinity will begin (this search may take up to 60 seconds.)

Select the phone that which you wish

to pair using or , then ok to confirm.

From your Bluetooth® device, accept the pairing request.

When the "Name of connected Bluetooth device" message is displayed on the audio system screen, this indicates that the Bluetooth® device is automatically stored and connected to the vehicle.

Your device is then visible in the list of recognised phones which can also be accessed in the "Select a phone" submenu

If the pairing has not been successful after 60 seconds, the "Pairing failed" message appears. Repeat these operations to carry out the desired action.

Please refer to your telephone's user guide for further information.

Note: depending on your phone, it may be useful to accept the transfer of vour phonebook and call history.

## Pairing a Bluetooth® phone with the audio system via your phone

This method allows you to make a Bluetooth® search from your phone.

To pair your phone, carry out the following operations:

- press to access the main menu:

select the "Phone" world using

or . then ok to confirm:

select "Pair a phone" using the

or . then ok to confirm.

The "Enter the code: XXXXXX" message appears on the audio system screen and a 60 seconds countdown starts

The audio system is then visible to other Bluetooth® devices for approximately 60 seconds.

Search for the audio system using your telephone, then select it (see your telephone user manual) or accept the pairing code with your telephone.

The "MY CAR" or "Dacia Media Control Multimédia " message is displayed on the audio system screen to confirm that your phone is paired and connected to the audio system.

The " Dacia Media Control Multimédia " message appears on the screen only if the Dacia Media Control app is connected to the audio system and if the app is installed on your smartphone.

If pairing fails, the audio system display returns to the "Phone" world.

## Unpairing a telephone



Unpairing allows a phone to be deleted from the audio system memory.

To unpair and delete your phone from the audio system memory, perform the following steps:

- press **1** to access the main menu;
- select the "Settings" world, then "Phone settings" followed by "Delete

phone" by pressing or , then

to confirm:



- select the phone that which you wish

to unpair using or , then

OK to confirm:

– select "YES" using ▲ or ▼

then OK to confirm.

If six phones are already stored, the system offers to delete one of the devices. By selecting "YES", you will be redirected to the "Delete a phone" menu.



To unpair and delete all phones from the audio system memory:

- press to access the main menu:
- select the "Settings" menu, then "Phone settings" followed by "Delete

all" by pressing or then

oK to confirm;

– select "YES" using ▲ or ▼.

then OK to confirm.

**Note:** all contacts in the phonebook and the call log in the synchronised audio system will be deleted.



Your hands-free phone system is only intended to facilitate communication by reducing the risk factors, without removing them completely. Always comply with the laws of the country in which you are travelling.

## Connecting/disconnecting a phone

## Connecting a paired phone

Your phone must be connected to the hands-free phone system in order to use all its functions.

A telephone cannot be connected to the hands-free telephone system unless it has previously been paired.

Please refer to the information on "Pairing a phone" in the "Pairing/ unpairing a phone" section.

Note: vour phone's Bluetooth® connection must be activated and set to "visible".

#### **Automatic connection**

As soon as the vehicle ignition is switched on, the audio system searches for paired telephones in the vicinity.

Note: the last phone to have been connected is given priority.

Searching will continue until a paired telephone is found (this may take several minutes).

Note: for more information on the list of compatible phones, please contact an approved dealer:

 you can use automatic telephone connection with the ignition switched on. You may need to activate the automatic Bluetooth® connection function on your hands-free phone system. To do this, refer to your phone user manual:

- when reconnecting, if two paired phones are within range of the handsfree system, the last phone to have been connected will take priority, even if this phone is outside the vehicle but within range of the hands-free system: - if a call is already in progress when your hands-free telephone system is connected, the telephone will connect automatically and the conversation audio will switch to the vehicle speakers.



Your hands-free phone system is only intended to facilitate

For safety reasons, carry out these operations when the vehicle is stationary.



Manual connection (changing the phone connected)

Press to access the main menu, select the "Phone" world using the



on the steering column control,



or . then OK to confirm.

Select the "Select phone" menu by pressing on the steering column control. or . then ok to

The list of phones already paired is displayed.

Select the phone that you wish to connect from the list using the control

knob on the steering column, (A) or

, then to confirm.

A message will appear to confirm that the telephone is connected.

**Note:** if a phone is already connected when switching to another phone, the

existing connection is automatically replaced by that of the new phone.


#### Connection failure

If connection fails, check that:

- vour phone is switched on;
- your phone battery is not flat;
- your phone has already been paired to the hands-free telephone system;
- Bluetooth® is now enabled on your phone and on the audio system;
- the phone is configured to accept the audio system's connection request.

**Note:** using your hands-free telephone system for prolonged periods will discharge your phone's battery more quickly.

## Telephone information



Once connected, the audio system displays telephone-related information:

- the type of connection to the multimedia system 1;
- the telephone battery level 2;
- the telephone network status 3.

## Disconnect a phone



To disconnect your telephone, you can:

- deactivate the Bluetooth®Bluetooth® function on your audio system;
- deactivate your phone's Bluetooth® function:
- delete the paired phone via the audio system. Please refer to the information on "Unpairing a phone" in the "Pairing, unpairing a phone" section.

If the phone is switched off, the phone will be disconnected.

A message is then displayed on the audio system screen to confirm that the phone is disconnected.

Note: if a call is in progress when the phone is disconnected, the call will be automatically transferred to your phone.

To deactivate Bluetooth® on your audio system, refer to the information on the "Bluetooth® function" in the "General Description" section.

To disable your smartphone's Bluetooth®, refer to your phone's user quide.

To unpair and delete the Bluetooth® phone, see the information under "Unpairing a phone" in the "Pairing. unpairing a phone" section.

## Making/receiving a call

## Call a contact from your call log history



To display the call history:

- access the "Phone" world by

pressing , then press or

to select "Phone", then OK to confirm:

select "Calls" by pressing or

| ▼ . then OK to confirm;

 Select the contact or number you want to call by pressing or or then OK to make the call.

## Receiving a call



When receiving a call, the caller's number is displayed on the audio system screen (this function depends on the options you have subscribed to with your telephone service provider). If the caller's number is in one of the memories, the name of the caller is displayed instead of the number. If the caller's number cannot be displayed, the "Private number"

message is displayed on the audio system screen.

To accept an incoming call:

- select the icon using or ▼ . then OK to confirm: or
- press briefly on K.

To reject an incoming call:

- select the icon using or . then OK to confirm; or
- press and hold on .



It is recommended that you stop your vehicle before entering a number or searching for a contact.

## Receiving a second call



When receiving a second call, the second caller's number is displayed on the audio system screen (this function depends on the options you have subscribed to with your telephone service provider). You can:

- accept the incoming call by selecting



- reject the incoming call by selecting



- put an incoming call on hold by selecting 1.

To end a call during the conversation,

press 🗀

## During a call

You can:

- adjust the volume by pressing 4+





- end the call by pressing .



Press or . then ok to confirm.

You can also:

- accept the incoming call/resume a
- call placed on hold by selecting lacksquare;
- end a call by selecting during the conversation:
- put a call on hold by selecting 1;
- select 2 to use the audio system keypad to enter the digits.



The system allows managing call waiting when your phone is connected (depending on your plan).

## Using the keypad during a call



To use the audio system keypad during a call:

- select the audio system keypad

using or , then ok to confirm;

- select the number or character using

or ▼, then oK to confirm your choice.

**Note:** to return to the previous screen,

press 🗀.

For safety reasons, carry out any adjustments while the vehicle is stationary.

## **Audio settings**



From the main menu, browse by

pressing or until you reach the "Settings" world, then select "Audio".

Select "Audio settings", then OK to confirm.

The following settings are available:

- "Equaliser";
- "Spatialisation":
- "Volume mph (km/h)";



"Priority to DR"

# Bluetooth® audio playback

In order to use your Bluetooth® portable digital audio device, you must pair it to the vehicle upon first use. Refer to the "Pairing, unpairing a phone" section.

Pairing enables the audio system to recognise and store a Bluetooth® portable digital audio device.

#### Note:

- if your Bluetooth® portable digital audio device is equipped with telephone and portable audio player functions, pairing one of the functions will automatically involve pairing the other;
- the number of functions which can be accessed depends on the type of portable digital audio player and its compatibility with the audio system.



#### Connecting to the vehicle

Your portable digital audio device must be connected to the audio system via Bluetooth® **a** or USB **b** in order for you to access all of its features.



Only handle the portable audio player when traffic conditions permit.

Store the portable audio player safely while driving (risk of being thrown in the event of sudden braking or impact).

For a device already paired, perform the following operations:

- activate the radio Bluetooth® connection;
- enable your telephone or portable digital audio device Bluetooth® connection and make it visible to other devices (refer to the user manual for your device);
- select the audio source Bluetooth®

by repeatedly pressing on select the external audio player or the telephone to be connected via Bluetooth® among those detected by the multimedia system.

#### Use


Your portable digital audio player must be connected to the audio system to enable access to all of its features.







# Pairing a Bluetooth® phone with the audio system via the audio system

When the "Name of connected Bluetooth device" message is displayed on the audio system screen, this indicates that the Bluetooth® device is automatically stored and connected to the vehicle.

If the pairing has not been successful after 60 seconds, the "Pairing failed" message appears. Repeat these operations to carry out the desired action.

Please refer to your telephone's user guide for further information.

Note: depending on your phone, it may be useful to accept the transfer of vour phonebook and call history.

## Pairing a Bluetooth® phone with the audio system via your phone

This method allows you to make a Bluetooth® search from your phone.

The "Enter the code: XXXXXX" message appears on the audio system screen and a 60 seconds countdown starts

The "MY CAR" or "Dacia Media Control Multimédia " message is displayed on the audio system screen to confirm that your phone is paired and connected to the audio system.

The " Dacia Media Control Multimédia " message appears on the screen only if the Dacia Media Control app is connected to the audio system and if the app is installed on your smartphone.

Searching will continue until a paired telephone is found (this may take several minutes).

Note: for more information on the list of compatible phones, please contact an approved dealer:

 vou can use automatic telephone connection with the ignition switched on. You may need to activate the automatic Bluetooth® connection function on your hands-free phone system. To do this, refer to your phone user manual:

- when reconnecting, if two paired phones are within range of the handsfree system, the last phone to have been connected will take priority, even if this phone is outside the vehicle but within range of the hands-free system: - if a call is already in progress when your hands-free telephone system is connected, the telephone will connect automatically and the conversation audio will switch to the vehicle speakers.



#### « Simulcast »

Depending on the country, this function switches from a DR station to the equivalent FM station if the digital signal is lost.

If the "FM/DR simulcast" is activated. there may be lag of a few seconds when switching from FM to DR or from DR to FM There may also be a difference in the sound volume.

The system will automatically switch back to DR as soon as the digital signal is received.

Note: during the simulcast, the station name is preceded by "FM> ».

### "Priority to DR"

Depending on the country, this function allows you to select an FM station (if the radio station requested is also available in digital) and switch to the equivalent DR station to obtain better sound quality.

Note: while DR is prioritised, the station name is preceded by " DR> ».

#### « TA »

When this feature is activated, your audio system searches for and automatically plays traffic bulletins as new reports are broadcast by some "FM" or "DR" radio stations.

#### USING VOICE RECOGNITION

## Voice recognition system

The audio system can be used to operate voice recognition via your smartphone (if compatible). This makes it possible to control the functions of your smartphone by voice, while keeping your hands on the steering wheel.

#### Note:

- vour smartphone's voice recognition system only enables you to use the functions provided with your smartphone. It does not enable you to interact with the other audio system functions, such as the radio etc.
- when using voice recognition, the audio system will use the language set on your smartphone:
- if you try to use your vehicle's voice recognition system with a paired smartphone that is not equipped with voice recognition, a message will be displayed on the audio system screen to notify you.

#### Using voice recognition with vour phone



#### **Activation**

To activate the voice recognition system, you must:

- have a 3G, 4G signal or WIFI on your smartphone:
- activate the Bluetooth® function on your smartphone and make it visible to other devices (refer to your smartphone user manual):
